- Users must join via computer Needs setup from CAM unless a Board member has Office 365
- Max 300 attendees
- Attendees can unmute

# Microsoft Teams Commeetings

Zoom Meetings allow for full participation from all attendees.

Cost: Business: Max 300 participants for \$19.99/month/ license (minimum total of \$199.90) Enterprise: Max 500 participants for \$19.99/month/ license (minimum total \$1,999.00)

#### Pros:

Users can join via phone or computer Full partcipation from all attendees

### Cons:

- Attendees can unmute
- Limited screen sharing
  - Security limitations

## **Zoom** webinars

Zoom Webinars allow for the hosts and presenters to appear on-screen and limit the other attendees to comments-only.

#### Cost:

500 Attendees: \$140.00/ month/webinar license + \$14.99/month/host license (minimum total of \$154.99) 1000 Attendees: \$340.00/ month/webinar license + \$14.99/month/host license (minimum total of \$354.99)

#### Pros:

Only hosts and presenters have screens visible and microphone access Presenters can be added to the meeting from the audience to speak Users can join via phone or computer

#### Cons:

- Attendees can only communicate via chat
- Security limitations
